



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FERRARA

CITY OF ART AND CULTURE



Capital of the Renaissance, metaphysical city, city of art, the names given to this city are a reminder of how art and culture are omnipresent in Ferrara, in the nature of the city itself and its possible visitor itineraries. As the first example of a modern city, Ferrara was the site of one of the most important urban projects in Italian history, the Addizione Erculea, which sought to harmoniously integrate the city with its medieval side. The Este Castle, the Palazzo dei Diamanti, which today hosts major international exhibitions, the Palazzo Schifanoia with its museum and the entire historic centre are essential stops to understand the Ferrara of yesterday and today, with its metaphysical overtones and the base for the writings of Bassani. In Ferrara, every corner tells a story, and with us, you can discover the one that best suits your travel spirit.





An evocative journey through the centuries, discovering the ancient military fortress and symbol of the city, accompanied by stories and anecdotes from a local guide. A backdrop to the splendours of the ducal court, the Este Castle is a place rich in history and charm. Amidst cursed loves, court intrique, illustrious personalities and sumptuous banquets, a journey through time takes shape: from the dungeons that bear witness to the sad affair of Don Giulio d'Este, to the magic of the Orange Garden, Ariosto's inspiration for the enchanted landscapes of Orlando Furioso, through the frescoed halls of the piano nobile.

A spectacular palace of the splendid court of the Este family, who used it to escape the boredom between parties, dances and banquets, the Schifanoia Museum is one of the most important buildings in the history of Italian art. In the Salone dei Mesi you can admire an imposing cycle of frescoes by the masters of the Officina Ferrarese, Francesco del Cossa and Ercole de' Roberti. The experience is even more fascinating by the modern layout, opened in 2020 to preserve an incredible civic, historical and artistic heritage, but with the exciting dynamism of storytelling.

SCHIFANOIA

MUSEUM

Founded in 1929, the Cathedral Museum found its permanent home in 2000 in the former church of San Romano, the most important sacred temple of Este spirituality. It houses priceless artifacts dating from the early Middle Ages to the 19th century. The monumental organ doors depicting St George, the Dragon and the Annunciation are by Cosmè Tura, while the Master of the Months created the 13thcentury panels that adorn Porta dei Pellegrini. Instead, Jacopo della Quercia is credited with having painted the splendid Madonna of the Pomegranate. Skilful staging and carefully considered lighting enhance these works of rare wonder.

The National Museum of Italian Judaism and the Shoah was established with the mission of **recounting** over two thousand years of Jewish history in Italy. Ferrara, a city rich in history, serves as an emblematic location that encapsulates various experiences of this millennia-old history. Since the time of the Este family, Ferrara has woven an inextricable relationship with the Jewish community. The museum's site itself is deeply symbolic, as it is located in the former city prisons where anti-fascists and Jews were imprisoned in the early 20th century.

Through a guided tour that weaves between the ancient and recent history of Italian Judaism, visitors are led through the key milestones that have shaped the experiences and movements of the Jewish people: from the destruction of the Temple in Jerusalem to the creation of ghettos, with a focus on the tragedy of the Shoah.

Inside the prestigious Palazzo Costabili, also known as Palazzo "of Ludovico il Moro", is the National Archaeological Museum of Ferrara. The magnificent finds from the excavations of the ancient city and necropolis of Spina are housed in this treasure chest of antiquity. Every room in the museum evokes and bears witness to the city's wealth: from the Cortile d'Onore to the Sala degli Ori (Hall of Gold Jewellery), from the Sala delle Carte Geografiche (Hall of Maps) to the Sala delle Piroghe (Piroques Room), from the Sala del Tesoro (Treasure Hall) with frescoes by Benvenuto Tisi, known as Garofalo, between 1503 and 1506, with a masterly trompe-l'oeil effect, finally losing oneself in the green and silent labyrinth of the Palazzo Costabili gardens.

WALKING TOUR

EVERY CORNER TELLS A STORY

Ferrara is a city of many souls and personalities: our walking tours will take you on a journey of discovery, with itineraries designed to show you the most important places, monuments and views, and themed itineraries that will allow you to discover the stories and personalities that are inextricably linked to the Este capital, from ever new angles and perspectives.



MEDIEVAL ITINERARY

To really understand the origins of the city of Ferrara, you need to immerse yourself in the Middle Ages. What better way than a fascinating tour of the city's historic heart with an experienced local guide? Medieval Ferrara includes some of the most evocative places in the historic centre, from the splendid Via delle Volte, which followed the course of the river Po, with its magnificent arches, to the characteristic views of the Jewish Ghetto, the backdrop to the daily life of one of the oldest communities in Europe, through the Piazza della Cattedrale and Piazzetta Municipale. A stop at the Estense Castle, still surrounded by an imposing moat and drawbridges, the majestic symbol of the city, is not to be missed.

RENAISSANCE ITINERARY

The most famous aspect of the city is its Renaissance heritage, recognized as a UNESCO World Heritage site. It is the 15th-century Addizione Erculea that characterized Ferrara as 'the first modern' **city in Europe'**, shaping its features even in future developments. The itinerary, accompanied by a qualified guide, will take you along the majestic Corso Ercole I d'Este, the intersection of the Quadrivio degli Angeli, which connects the Estense Castle to the Porta degli Angeli. A detour to Piazza Ariostea, the stage for the traditional Palio races, designed by the famous architect Biagio Rossetti. Between the majestic palaces, you can get a glimpse of the Massari Park and the magnificent Certosa Monumentale. This is the perfect route to appreciate the modernity of the Este city.

The tour can also be organised with a focus on Ariosto-related sites or on the notable women of the Este court.



JEWISH ITINERARY

The history of the city of Ferrara is closely linked to that of its ancient Jewish community. The medieval district is still home to the synagogue and preserves the historical memory of the past, among the streets of the old ghetto. Via Mazzini was the heart of the commercial and social life of the community. Starting from the Cathedral of San Giorgio, we walk through the streets of the city center, discovering the history of the city community, with a look at Corso Ercole I d'Este and Corso della Giovecca. There are many places to visit here to get an understanding of everyday Jewish life, traditions and cuisine.

It is possible to extend the itinerary with an in-depth look at the life and works of the Ferrarese writer Giorgio Bassani and/ or a visit to the Jewish cemetery in Via delle Vigne (subject to opening days and hours).

The itinerary can be rounded off with a visit to the MEIS - National Museum of Italian Judaism and the Shoah.

MYSTERY TOUR

A guided tour to discover legends, astrological symbols and mysteries, to uncover some of the most compelling secrets and stories from the city's history, in the picturesque alleyways, ancient churches and noble residences. Starting with the façade of the cathedral, with its hidden esoteric symbols, and the Church of San Domenico, famous for its "Devil's Footprint", the unsettling adventures of the magician-engineer Bartolomeo Chiozzi, straddling history and popular legend, will be re-enacted. The itinerary then takes us to the Oratorio dell'Annunziata, the ancient seat of the Confraternita della Buona Morte (Brotherhood of the Good Death), and to Via Savonarola, where the mysterious death of the court poet Ercole Strozzi took place; or from Torquato Tasso's cell along Corso Ercole I D'Este, ending at Palazzo dei Diamanti, a visible example and culmination of Borso d'Este's great passion for astrology.



FERRARA AND THE CINEMA

From Michelangelo Antonioni to Florestano Vancini, from Luchino Visconti to Vittorio de Sica, and even to the directors of more recent TV series, Ferrara's relationship with the world of cinema has been established for over a century. Accompanied by a guide, you will explore the locations that have served as set for important films, whose charm has inspired famous movies, short films, and TV series embedded in the collective imagination, most notably The Garden of the Finzi-Contini.

The itinerary winds through the medieval historical center to the Renaissance Addition, following in the footsteps of cinematic protagonists and stories that still echo through the city's alleys, gardens, and squares. Upon request, the tour can be enhanced with a visit to the Spazio Antonioni, the museum dedicated to the life and work of one of the greatest figures in modern cinema.


A CITY TO BE LIVED AT A SLOW PACE

SLOW TOURISM

An ideal place for slow tourism, Ferrara is a city of bicycles, crossed by picturesque rivers. Cycling is a way of life for its residents, who have been accustomed since childhood to getting around quickly and comfortably on two wheels. Flat and "on a human scale", Ferrara has a compact historic centre surrounded by 9 kilometres of restored ancient walls and about 13 kilometres of sottomura, where bastions, towers and gates bear witness to the city's ancient defences. Together with the Bassani Urban Park, this green embrace of pedestrian and cycle paths forms the natural lungs of the city. In Ferrara, the call for slow tourism is so compelling that to spend a day on the Po River by bike or by boat is an experience not to be missed.





Boat trips from the dock in Ferrara on the Po di Volano, an ancient branch of the Po delta which, together with the Po di Primaro, gave rise to the first urban settlement in the Byzantine period. We will sail along the waters of the ancient river, parallel for a long stretch to the city walls, catching sight of the towers of the Estense Castle and the medieval bell towers of the square, until we reach the bell tower of the first Cathedral of San Giorgio, in front of the city's defensive walls, and the Ferrara countryside. A small aperitif during the cruise is included.


Excursion on board the historic Nena, an ancient Venetian steamboat to discover the river origins of the Este city and its evolution through the Middle Ages and the Renaissance up to the present day. Boarding at the San Paolo dock, in the heart of the city, close to the historic centre. We sail on the waterway that joins Ferrara to the Po. An unusual cross-section of the city, a natural corridor where herons, bee-eaters and turtles live undisturbed. Passing through the Pontelagoscuro reservoir, a scenic backdrop to the majesty of the Po River with its spectacular views, you will skirt Giarina beach, the ancient Isola Bianca (Lipu Oasis) and discover its heronry with nesting herons. A small aperitif during the cruise is included.

A cruise along the Po di Volano, **on one of the ancient waterways beloved by the Este family**, along which they built the most beautiful Delizie, summer residences created for recreation and pleasure. From the dock in Ferrara, through the countryside of Ferrara with its small villages, we will cruise to the Villa La Mensa, an ancient 15th-century villa, one of the Delizie residences of the D'Este family and the only one still accessible by water.

Stop for a guided tour of the villa (2 hours).

TASTE FERRARA

FOOD AND WINE EXPERIENCES

Cristoforo (from) Messisbugo, in his mid-sixteenth century cookbook "Libro novo. Nel quale s'insegna a far d'ogni sorte di vivande (...)" was the first chef to put down on paper several recipes using ingredients that are very common today. A ducal attendant at the Este court, he was first a scalco (a skilled meat butcher) and then a chef. We owe many specialities of Ferrara cuisine to his creativity between the Middle Ages and the Renaissance, including pasticcio di maccheroni. With ancient traditions and curious anecdotes (it is said that egg tagliatelle were inspired by the hair of Duchess Lucrezia Borgia), **Ferrara offers a cuisine with surprising combinations**, such as those that make Cappellaccio so unique.





A fun and engaging way to discover one of the fundamental aspects of Ferrara's tradition and folklore: its food and wine specialties! In this cooking class, you will literally get your hands dirty with dough while learning technical skills, fascinating facts, and legends about the most famous traditional dishes, all culminating in a final tasting.

You'll discover the "coppia", Ferrara's bread with its unusual cross shape, whose crunchy twists are said to have been inspired by the golden curls of Lucrezia Borgia, and the "ricciola", a fragrant, savory breakfast ring. Then, the "cappellacci di zucca", pumpkin-filled pasta that is a symbol of the city, followed by the rich and indulgent "torta tenerina" with its soft, melting heart, and the "brazadlin", typical homemade cookies, delightfully crumbly.

A city with an extensive culinary tradition, as noted above, **Ferrara offers a wide range of food and wine specialities to please all palates**. To taste a little of everything, InFerrara offers personalized tasting sessions in breathtaking locations such as the splendid Porta Paola, the green and famous

Piazza Ariostea or the not-to-be-missed Palazzo dei Diamanti; tasting a local speciality in places that symbolise the city's history guarantees an authentic Ferrara experience!

Whether tasting Ferrara bread with a slice of "zia", a tasty local salami, the famous cappellacci di zucca or discovering traditional desserts, the right panorama becomes an integral part of the experience.

And for those who wish to delve deeper into the tradition and see who still carries it on, the tasting can be accompanied by a small workshop on pasta dough, held by a Ferrara-based sfoglina (pasta maker), with whom you can try your hand at some of the preparation steps, such as closing the cappellacci.

The city, with its eclectic, creative and sophisticated soul, offers a rich programme of unmissable events and manifestations, capable of attracting hundreds of thousands of visitors every year: from New Year's Eve to great concerts in the most evocative locaations in the city center, from food and wine festivals to the now historic Ferrara Buskers Festival and the great exhibitions at the Palazzo dei Diamanti. Ferrara is constantly buzzing and has something to please everyone, of all ages, with an ever-changing calendar of events!





The major exhibitions at the Palazzo dei Diamanti are internationally renowned, the masterpieces of the great names of ancient, modern and contemporary art come to life again in halls of the palace, symbol of the Addizione Erculea and the Ferrara Capital of the Renaissance. The installations, curated by the Ferrara Arte Foundation, respect the historic site, enhancing the works and creating an exciting combination of ever-changing interpretations. Exhibitions often create valuable connections with the city, offering focused explorations, in-depth studies, as well as targeted events and dedicated series. It's a comprehensive experience that takes you from discovering the precious palace to exploring the city itself. In a city like Ferrara, a dive into art is simply a must.

In October 2024, a new exhibition on the Ferrara Renaissance will open, following the success of the one that marked the reopening of Palazzo dei Diamanti in February 2023, after its significant restoration.

From October 12th 2024 to February 16th 2025 "The 16th Century in Ferrara. Mazzolino, Ortolano, Garofalo, Dosso."

Experience the wonderful festive atmosphere: Christmas and New Year in Ferrara.

Kilometers of lights and decorations illuminate the old town, climbing up the main streets, while the impressive decorated tree watches over the square, adorning the view of the Cathedral of San Giorgio. There is no shortage of traditional markets on the listone of Piazza Trento and Trieste, to help residents and tourists fill any empty space under the tree. Pretty little wooden chalets also grace Piazza del Municipio.

A range of large and small events, shows and surprises accompany us as we head towards Christmas and on to the final celebration on New Year's Eve. **Famous across Italy, the fire at the Estense Castle marks midnight, bringing in the New Year.**

If you are a Christmas lover or a New Year enthusiast, Ferrara has something for you: during the holidays, wishes come true!



The Palio di Ferrara is one of the most important and oldest events the city has to offer. Discover the unique atmosphere of the ancient Piazza Nova - the magnificent Piazza Ariostea - in the days leading up to the races. The Palio is not just the important final competition between the eight city quarters, watched over by the Corte Ducale, the races are preceded by the historical parade, the flag-waving and music competitions in Piazza Municipale and, above all, the traditional propitiatory dinners.

To experience the Palio is to live a few moments of typical folklore, excitement and energy; and the parade of the historical procession is an enthralling experience that takes you back to the glorious past of the Este court.

The Ferrara Summer Festival is when great music comes to town! Nearly two months of entertainment in the historic center, featuring big names from the international and national music scenes, along with theater, comedy, and performances.

The Ferrara Summer Festival attracts audiences from all over Italy each year with its eclectic program: from sporting events to concerts by legendary Italian and international artists, as well as performances by the most popular contemporary bands and comedy shows.

Over the years, the Ferrara Summer Festival stage has hosted artists of the caliber of **Gianni Morandi, Francesco De Gregori, Antonello Venditti, Pooh, Giuseppe Giacobazz**i, as well as international stars like Europe, the Black Eyed Peas, and renowned DJs such as **Paul Kalkbrenner, Disclosure, and Peggy Gou**. Other notable acts include **Coma Cose, Calcutta, and Annalisa.**



A favourite habit of many Ferrara residents, proud of their little gem of a theatre located in the city center, is to spend an evening there. The Teatro Comunale of Ferrara has been located a few steps away from the Estense Castle since the end of the 18th century, when the Cardinal Legate Borghese commissioned it from architect Antonio Foschini and Cosimo Morelli. Renovated in the midtwentieth century by the Ferrara engineer Carlo Savonuzzi, it has since offered major seasons of drama, dance, opera, classical and other music, as well as experimental theatre. Since 2014, the theatre has been named after the great conductor Claudio Abbado to commemorate his wish to establish the Chamber Orchestra of Europe there. A magnificent example of Italian-style theatre, acoustically excellent. An evening at the theatre, with the customary aperitif before entry, could be the perfect opportunity to do something different during your stay in Ferrara.

The wonderful architecture of the interior also provides the ideal setting to enjoy the season's events to the full!

The Darsena comes to life, every year, during the summer months. This space, restored and returned to the city, overlooks the Po di Volano, the urban branch of the great river Po. It is the quintessential place to spend the warmest evenings, refreshed by the river breeze. In just a few years, the Darsena has become one of the most beloved gathering spots for the people of Ferrara, especially during the summer season.

Whether it's for a jogging session, an aperitif, a picnic or as a boarding point for a river excursion, the Darsena is a space to enjoy at any time of the day.

In summer, it buzzes with a rich program of events, including food, wine tastings, music, and dance, organized by various local associations that create a diverse, almost non-stop festival from mid-May to September. All that's left is to choose one -or more- of the many events according to your tastes!



The Ferrara Buskers Festival has become a tradition: since 1988, and on an international scale, the festival has brought street arts to the city, with a special focus on music and cultures from the most diverse corners of the world. Its important mission is to highlight art in all its forms and the talent of artists who are often not in the spotlight. This is an event of sharing and great emotions, where every step reveals a new cultural and human dimension, creating a festive atmosphere in the final days of August.

For the past few years, invited artists have given a preview performance in the magnificent Comacchio, the jewel of the Po Delta, for an evening filled with atmosphere among the town's bridges and canals.

It's a unique opportunity to visit Ferrara and its Po Delta Park and to experience all its nuances.

Of great interest, and continuously updated, are the educational programs and workshops related to the exhibitions at Palazzo dei Diamanti, where the **autumn 2024** opening will be the exhibition *The 16th Century in Ferrara: Mazzolino, Ortolano, Garofalo, Dosso.* This exhibition continues an extensive project on the Ferrara Renaissance, offering schools of various levels the opportunity to explore the evolution of artistic language at a time when the city became one of the main centers of the Italian Renaissance.





The tour explores the most representative sites of Ferrara's historic center, a UNESCO World Heritage site that perfectly balances the Middle Ages and the Renaissance period. The visit begins at the Este Castle, an imposing fortress, ultimate expression of the court power and patronage. It then moves towards the central squares, such as Piazza Savonarola and Piazza Trento e Trieste, stopping at the Cathedral and the Ducal Palace.

The itinerary continues through the medieval streets of the oldest part of the city and the district of the ancient Jewish ghetto, concluding with a view of the monumental Corso Ercole I d'Este, the main axis of the so-called Renaissance Addition.

Available upon request the visit of Palazzo Schifanoia, Cathedral Museum or Casa Ariosto instead of the Este Castle tour.



A comprehensive guided tour through the medieval heart and the Renaissance district, known as the Addizione Erculea. After an optional bus tour to admire the ancient city walls, you will visit Ariosto's house, where the poet spent his final years, and then head to the famous Palazzo dei Diamanti. Passing through Piazza Ariostea, which hosts the Palio races in May, the itinerary continues towards the Este Castle (external view). Free time for lunch.

In the afternoon, a walk through the central squares and medieval streets, such as Via delle Volte, famous for its arches, and the Jewish Ghetto; the Cathedral and the Ducal Palace. The last stop is Palazzo Schifanoia, with the splendid frescoes of the so called "Hall of the Months".

As an alternative to Palazzo Schifanoia, you can visit the Este Castle, the Cathedral Museum, the National Archaeological Museum, or MEIS. The itinerary can also be enhanced with an interactive walk through the medieval district, where students will be engaged with simple riddles or clues to be found around the city.

Discover the most important museums of Ferrara accompanied by a special quide who, dressed in Renaissance attire, will make the visit a playful and interactive experience. The young visitors will explore the magnificent "Hall of the Months" at Palazzo Schifanoia, being enchanted by a world of zodiac signs, astrological icons, and court figures that adorn the walls of this outstanding palace, formerly called "delizia". They will be led through the evocative halls of the majestic Este Castle, the prisons, and the beautiful hanging Garden of the Oranges, where they will relive, through simple games and riddles, life during the time of the Dukes of Ferrara—what they ate, how ladies and knights spent their leisure time—accompanied by the quide's anecdotes. Additionally, they can immerse themselves in the fascinating atmosphere of the Cathedral Museum, rich in symbolism and stories, discovering the legend of the city's patron, Saint George and the Dragon.

A guided tour to discover the fascinating Teatro Comunale of Ferrara, considered one of the most remarkable examples of "Italian-style" theatres, with its architectural structures that have remained almost entirely unchanged over its more than 200-year history, and the somewhat magical, open yet seemingly hidden space known as the Rotonda Foschini.

The internal guided tour offers the opportunity to immerse oneself in an atmosphere of creativity, music, and performance, revealing some of the behind-the-scenes secrets. Visitors will explore the Main Theatre Hall, the Ridotto Rooms, the Library, and the evocative Sala degli Argani, a "nonplace" located in the attic of the building that houses the original winches, dating back to the 18th century, which were used to raise the chandeliers.

A FAIRYTALE AT THE MUSEUM - ANIMATED VISIT

A fairytale narrated through the halls of the exhibition The 16th Century in Ferrara - an enchanting animated story that brings to life the tales of artists who lived at the court of Duke Alfonso I d'Este: from the eccentric Mazzolino, to the guiet Ortolano, the tireless Garofalo, and the ironic and dreamy Dosso Dossi. The rooms of Palazzo dei Diamanti become the fairytale setting for an engaging narrative journey designed for the little ones, allowing them to observe some of the exhibited works accompanied by objects, words, and images that spark wonder. Suitable for kindergarten (age 5) and primary school (grades 1 and 2).

A for Ariosto, B for white lead, C for collecting... The Renaissance alphabet is enriched with new keywords that will guide us through the exhibition The 16th Century in Ferrara. Viewing the exhibited works and hearing the stories of artists, writers, and poets active in an increasingly refined and ambitious Este court will lead students to discover the language of Ferrarese and Italian art at the beginning of the 16th century. In the workshop, participants will be involved in creating a large collective dictionary that will help them understand the meaning of the key words of the High Renaissance.

SPEAKING WITH IMAGES - ANIMATED VISIT

An animated visit to the exhibition The 16th Century in Ferrara to explore the expressive language of the artists who frequented the Este court during the High Renaissance. Colors, symbols, gestures, and characters depicted within the works create a true symbolic alphabet that was easily understood by the people of the time but is more challenging to interpret today. This visit will allow participants to learn how to "read works of art" and create a personal image dictionary that connects past and present.

NAMES, OBJECTS, CITIES - VISIT WITH WORKSHOP IN THE EDUCATIONAL CLASSROOM

What did it mean to be an artist at the beginning of the 16th century? The works of Mazzolino, Ortolano, Garofalo, Dosso Dossi, and some of their contemporaries exhibited in The 16th Century in Ferrara provide an opportunity to reflect on the styles, subjects, patrons, and trends of the time during the Duchy of Alfonso I d'Este. What innovations were Titian and Raphael introducing in painting? How did Ludovico Ariosto influence the court painters? In the workshop, participants will create a large collective map to discover, learn about, and connect the main players in the art system of the time with the historical and political events of the city and other Italian courts.

We will sail along the waters of the ancient river, parallel for a long stretch to the city walls, catching sight of the towers of the Estense Castle and the medieval bell towers of the square, until we reach the bell tower of the first Cathedral of San Giorgio, in front of the city's defensive walls, and the Ferrara countrysid

Guided tour to discover the river origins of the Este city and its evolution through the Middle Ages and Renaissance to the present day. Embark at the San Paolo dock in Ferrara, on the Po di Volano, located in the heart of the city a stone's throw from the Castle.

We sail on the waterway that joins Ferrara, which was founded in ancient times on the banks of the river, to the Po. An unusual cross-section of the city, a natural corridor where herons, bee-eaters and turtles live undisturbed. Passing through the Pontelagoscuro reservoir, a scenic backdrop to the majesty of the Po river with spectacular views, you will skirt Giarina beach, the ancient Isola Bianca and discover its heronry with nesting herons.

Pellegrina Pibigas and Captain Atze, two surviving pirates of the Po, will take children on a real and imaginary journey down the river through the stories of the river people, populated by animals and fantastic creatures who are not always in a good mood, as in the story of the old pirate Sapan. **Between animal sightings, tattoos and pirate songs, the children, the new young pirates**, the stars of this river adventure, will be able, in a sort of collective ritual, to make a wish and entrust it to paper boats that will float to the sea pushed by the river current.

A cruise along the Po di Volano, on one of the ancient waterways beloved by the Este family, along which they built the most beautiful Delizie, summer residences created for recreation and pleasure. From the dock in Ferrara, through the countryside of Ferrara with its small villages, we will cruise to the Villa La Mensa, an ancient 15th-century villa, one of the Delizie residences of the D'Este family and the only one still accessible by water. Stop for a guided tour of the villa (2 hours).


